Meet January's Guest Speaker Dr. Karen Petty, PhD

Dr. Karen Petty, PhD, is a former early childhood teacher in Texas public school classrooms. She retired as Professor Emerita from *Texas Woman's University* in early child development and education where she began her teaching career as an assistant professor in 1998, serving as department chair and Professor until 2019. During her tenure with the university, Dr. Petty visited numerous US military installations worldwide, teaching those who worked with and cared for military children on base. These experiences led to the writing of her first book, *Deployment: Strategies for Working with Kids in Military Families*. Dr. Petty's resilience and research led her to write her recently published current book, *Kids and Grief: Talking with Children about Death and Dying*. Dr. Petty has also authored a third book, *Developmental Milestones of Young Children*, and has had numerous articles published in peer-reviewed journals.

Dr. Petty now lives in Tyler near family and her East Texas roots where she writes, camps, paints, and quilts as often as possible. As of January 1, 2024, Dr. Petty will serve ETWG as its newly elected Treasurer. Congratulations and welcome, Dr. Petty!

1. Motivation. Who doesn't need motivation? Writing is hard, and it is easy to procrastinate putting down that next story-or next sentence. When you come to ETWG meetings, you meet other writers, learn about their accomplishments, and get motivated to keep going with your own goals.

2.Support. Stuck? Sometimes all it takes is talking it out with another creative person. Looking for a beta reader? Writers like to read as much as they enjoy writing. Ask a few people in ETWG and you'll probably find at least one person willing to read your story. Have a technical issue or specific question? ETWG is filled with knowledgeable people who are willing to help.




4. Connection. Writing is a lonely business. You need people. People who get what you're doing. That's ETWG!
